Coronavirus Resources for Employers and Workers

In the face of COVID-19, the Labor & Workforce Development Agency (LWDA) wants to keep workers, employers, co-workers, and families safe. What employees are entitled to may be confusing. Click here for guidance to determine what is best for you, your family, and your workplace.

Work Sharing Program

Employers can apply for the <u>Unemployment Insurance (UI)</u> <u>Work Sharing program</u> as a temporary alternative to layoffs if the business' production or services have been reduced.

The Work Sharing program helps employers:

- Minimize or eliminate the need for layoffs in nearly all types of businesses or industries.
- Keep trained employees and quickly recover when business conditions improve.
- Avoid the cost of recruiting, hiring, and training new employees.

With Work Sharing, employees whose hours and wages have been reduced can:

- Receive UI benefits.
- Keep their current job.
- Avoid financial hardships.

The County of Orange is supporting local restaurants that are reopening safely.

<u>Apply for a \$5,000 grant</u> for reimbursement of masks, employee training, site reconfiguration, cleaning supplies, and more.

RESOURCES FOR RENTERS

Eviction Moratorium for Residential Tenants

On August 31, 2020 a new California law – <u>The Tenant,</u> <u>Homeowner and Small Landlord Relief and Stabilization Act of</u> <u>2020</u> - took effect to provide relief to residential tenants.

If you are unable to pay your rent due to a coronavirus-related hardship between September 1, 2020 and January 31, 2021, you must also pay at least 25 percent of the rent due to avoid eviction.

Beginning February 1, 2021, tenants will have to pay the full amount of rent to be protected from eviction.

Beginning March 1, 2021, landlords can take tenants to small claims court to recover unpaid rent debt regardless of how much the tenant owes. **Read more here.**



MENDEZ TRIBUTE MONUMENT AND PARK VIRTUAL GROUNDBREAKING



The City of Westminster, in partnership with the Orange County Department of Education (OCDE), will present a virtual groundbreaking of the new park and monument to honor the legacy of the historic Mendez v. Westminster case, which famously led to the desegregation of California's public schools.

Produced by OCDE, the online event will debut at 3:30 p.m. on Tuesday, October 13 on both the <u>City of Westminster</u> and <u>OCDE</u>'s respective Facebook pages, as well as the <u>OCDE Newsroom</u>.

Featuring pre-recorded reflections and remarks from city and county leaders, community members and local students, the virtual presentation not only serves as the official socially distanced groundbreaking for the park and memorial, but provides an opportunity for the community to come together – from neighborhoods near and far – to celebrate the landmark case that brought transformative change to Orange County and paved the way for the desegregation of schools across the nation.

SAFETY IN THE KITCHEN



Cooking is the leading cause of home fires, fire injuries, and fire deaths in Orange County. Follow the tips below to protect yourself and others from cooking fires.

Cooking Fire Safety Tips

- Stay in the kitchen when frying, grilling, or broiling food.
 If you have to leave the kitchen, even for a second, turn off the stove.
- Check food often while cooking. Use a timer to remind you that the stove or oven is on.
- Keep anything that can catch fire, including, oven mitts, paper towels, paper or plastic bags, curtains, or loose clothing away from the stove, oven, or other kitchen appliances.
- Keep the stovetop, burners, and oven clean.
- Turn pot and pan handles towards the back of the stove.
- Have a "kid-free zone" of at least three feet from the stove.
- Always check the oven to make sure it's empty before turning it on.
- Use the oven for cooking only, never for storage.
- Keep a lid or a fire extinguisher nearby when cooking.
- Avoid cooking while tired/sleepy or under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

In Case of Fire

- Never pour water on a grease fire! Cover the pan with a lid and turn off the stove.
- If there's a fire in the oven or microwave, keep the door closed and turn off the appliance.
- Leave your home immediately if a cooking fire is large or spreading quickly.
- Close the door behind you to slow the spread of fire and call 9-1-1 from outside the home.
- If you choose to use a fire extinguisher, make sure the fire is not spreading, smoke and fire have not filled the room, and that you have a clear escape path.

OC CHILD PASSENGER SAFETY RESOURCE GUIDE



Are you looking for car seat safety resources?

If you answered YES, this guide is for you!

There are many organizations throughout Orange County that provide car seat safety resources and services.

Click here to see what each organization offers.

Where can I get a free car seat? Many organizations provide car seats, some free of charge, to families who need a little extra help. Contact the organizations listed to see if you qualify. Supplies are limited. The types of car seats that each organization offers are shown in this guide. A virtual or in-person class on installing your new seat may be offered.

Where can I have my car seat checked? Are you wondering if your car seat is installed in your car correctly? Is your child fitting correctly in his/her seat? Many organizations have trained experts called Child Passenger Safety (CPS) Technicians, who can help, either virtually or in-person. You will feel confident installing your seat yourself and making sure your child fits correctly in that seat. Call to make an appointment today!

Who can I go to with questions? CPS Technicians have been trained and nationally certified on the topic of car seat safety. They can spot problems and know specific details about seats and cars on the market. They can also ensure that a child is in the correct seat for their age, height and weight. Contact a CPS Technician with questions you might have about car seat safety.

Where can I take a class? Classes are offered throughout the county, either virtually or in-person. Contact the organization for times and locations.

What is Kaitlyn's Law? Did you know that it is illegal to leave an unsupervised child, age six or younger, inside a car if: the engine is running, the keys are in the ignition or the child's health or safety is at risk? A person who is 12 or older may supervise. Many organizations provide information about this important law and safety risk.

Where can I find a Violator Class? Did you receive a traffic ticket related to car seats or leaving a child alone in a car? Did a judge direct you to take a car seat safety class? There are organizations in this guide that teach these classes. Your fine may be waived or reduced. Plus, you will learn valuable information about keeping your child safe in your car.


