FREE CORONAVIRUS TESTING

If you need to get tested for COVID-19, first ask your healthcare provider about FREE testing and care. <u>Click here</u> for major healthcare providers in Orange County.

The following types of testing sites are available:

- <u>Drive Thru Testing Clinics</u>, <u>Urgent Cares</u>, <u>and Labs</u>. These locations will utilize your health insurance with NO COPAY, and some for example, CVS will provide FREE testing for people without insurance. Contact them first to verify any costs and to make an appointment.
- OC COVID-19 Testing Network for those with Symptoms. If you have symptoms or someone in your household has COVID-19, and you cannot get a test though your healthcare provider, you can get a FREE medical assessment and test through the OC COVID-19 Testing Network. These are community health centers that offer testing and care, even if you don't have health insurance.
- OC COVID-19 Testing Super Sites for those with symptoms or meet other CA Department of Public Health (CDPH) criteria. These sites offer appointment-based drive-thru testing for individuals who cannot get a test through their medical provider and have symptoms or meet CDPH criteria such as being an essential worker or had close contact to someone with COVID-19.
- <u>State of California OptumServe Testing Sites.</u> These sites are recommended for asymptomatic people such as essential workers and those who have had close contact to someone with COVID-19.

The County of Orange COVID-19 Child Care Relief Program will distribute \$5 million in CARES Act funding to assist local child care businesses and nonprofits within the County of Orange that have been affected by COVID-19 and need assistance to survive and recover through this pandemic.



MAIN ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- Child Care Providers must have been affected by the COVID-19 public health emergency, including a reduction in revenue, layoffs, or voluntary and involuntary forced closures
- Child Care Providers must comply with child-to-staff ratios mandated by the State of California
- Child Care Providers must be located within the geographical boundaries of Orange County
- Child Care Providers must possess a valid child care license issued by the State of California Community Care Licensing, or provide a business statement of information if a license-exempt provider
- Child Care Providers must be open for business at the time of application or will open within 30 days of date of application

RESOURCES FOR RENTERS

Eviction Moratorium for Residential Tenants

On August 31, 2020 a new California law – <u>The Tenant,</u> <u>Homeowner and Small Landlord Relief and Stabilization Act of</u> <u>2020</u> - took effect to provide relief to residential tenants.

If you are unable to pay your rent due to a coronavirus-related hardship between September 1, 2020 and January 31, 2021, you must also pay at least 25 percent of the rent due to avoid eviction.

Beginning February 1, 2021, tenants will have to pay the full amount of rent to be protected from eviction.

Beginning March 1, 2021, landlords can take tenants to small claims court to recover unpaid rent debt regardless of how much the tenant owes. **Read more here.**





PUBLIC SAFETY MESSAGE FROM ORANGE COUNTY FIRE AUTHORITY

SMOKE ALARMS



Almost two-thirds of all home fire deaths occur in homes with no working smoke alarms. Protect your family by installing smoke alarms, inspecting them regularly, and practicing home fire drills.



Working smoke alarms reduce your risk of dying in a home fire by 50%.

Install

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, in hallways outside bedrooms or sleeping areas, and on every level of the home.
- Install smoke alarms on the ceiling or high on a wall.
 Make sure they are at least 10 feet from the stove and 3 feet from doors leading to the kitchen to reduce false alarms.
- Keep smoke alarms away from bathrooms with tubs or showers, heating or cooling ducts or vents, and ceiling or whole-house fans.
- Check the back for the manufacture date and replace all alarms when they are 10 years old.
- Use interconnected smoke alarms so when one sounds, they all sound.
- It's safest to use both ionization and photoelectric smoke alarms. Ionization alarms are quicker to warn about laming ires. Photoelectric alarms are quicker to warn about smoldering ires.
- Special alarms with strobe lights and bed shakers are available for people who are deaf or hard of hearing.

Inspect

- Test all smoke alarms once a month.
- Follow the manufacturer's instructions for cleaning to keep smoke alarms working well.

Protect

- Draw a home escape plan that shows two ways out of every room and an outside meeting place.
- Teach children what the smoke alarm sounds like and what to do if they hear it.
- Practice home fire drills at least twice a year.

OVERWHELMING PUBLIC SUPPORT OF TWO OCFA INJURED FIREFIGHTERS

A message from Chief Brian Fennessy

The fire family at Orange County Fire Authority is overwhelmed by the outpouring of support that people in the community are demonstrating for our two injured firefighters. We have received endless requests to help the injured men.

The OCFA Hand Crew Firefighters suffered severe burns on Monday, October 26 while battling the Silverado Fire. They remain intubated in critical condition with second and third degree burns over 50-65% of their bodies. Out of respect of the wishes of both families, no additional details are currently being shared on the conditions of their sons.


