#### **EXTENDED STAY-AT-HOME ORDER**

State officials have extended the regional stay home order for Southern California, which includes Orange County and affects Westminster. The order is extended until the ICU bed capacity returns to 15 percent or higher.

The State of California's Regional Stay Home Order instructs Californians to stay at home as much as possible to limit intermingling of multiple households that can lead to the spread of COVID-19.

**What's allowed:** You'll still be allowed to access to critical services and allows outdoor activities to preserve Californians' physical and mental health. This limited closure will help stop the surge and prevent overwhelming regional ICU capacity.


## Saliva At-Home Test Kits & Nostril Swab At-Home Test Kits

#### **NEW!** Westminster Boulevard Sidewalk Closure



Crews will close the sidewalk along eastbound Westminster Boulevard, between Springdale Street and Willow Lane.

The closure is needed to accommodate the southbound I-405 Westminster on-ramp extended closure as well as the bridge's upcoming traffic shift.

A detour will be in place for pedestrians and bicyclists to navigate around the closure.

The sidewalk is set to close as early as 10 p.m. Tuesday, Jan. 5, to 6 a.m. Tuesday, Jan. 12.

#### **Eviction Moratorium for Residential Tenants**

On August 31, 2020 a new California law – <u>The Tenant,</u> <u>Homeowner and Small Landlord Relief and Stabilization Act of</u> <u>2020</u> - took effect to provide relief to residential tenants.

If you are unable to pay your rent due to a coronavirus-related hardship between September 1, 2020 and January 31, 2021, you must also pay at least 25 percent of the rent due to avoid eviction.

Beginning February 1, 2021, tenants will have to pay the full amount of rent to be protected from eviction.

Beginning March 1, 2021, landlords can take tenants to small claims court to recover unpaid rent debt regardless of how much the tenant owes. **Read more here.**

The City of Westminster received a special allocation of Community Development Block Grant Coronavirus (CDBG-CV3) funds to be used to respond to the coronavirus (COVID-19) through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act). On December 9, 2020, the Westminster City Council approved funding of CDBG-CV3 funds to provide limited rental assistance to qualified Westminster residents financially impacted due to COVID-19.

Applications will be available beginning Monday, January 11, 2021 and must be submitted to the City between January 13, 2021 and January 28, 2021 by 5:00 p.m. Applicants will be selected by a lottery system and application approval is subject to funding availability. ### **HOUSING ELEMENT UPDATE**

The City of Westminster is in the process of updating the 2021-2029 Housing Element.

#### What is a Housing Element?

The Housing Element is a section of the City's General Plan that looks at housing needs and conditions within Westminster. It is a policy document that identifies goals, policies and programs that the City uses to direct and guide actions related to housing.

#### Why is the City updating its Housing Element?

Each city and county in California is required to have a Housing Element and update it at least every 8 years. Updating the Housing Element gives the City a clear picture of housing-related issues such as: housing supply and demand, the types of housing available within the City, housing affordability, and homelessness. Once the Housing Element is updated, it must be approved by the California Department of Housing and Community Development. Updating our Housing Element will ensure that we meet State requirements, and make Westminster eligible for State grants and other funding sources. It will also give our elected and appointed officials clear guidance on housing issues facing Westminster.



#### CARBON MONOXIDE ALARMS



When a carbon monoxide alarm sounds, move all people and pets outside immediately. Once outside, call 9-1-1. Do not go back inside until the fire department has declared the area safe and instructed you to do so.



Carbon monoxide (CO) is a deadly, odorless, poisonous gas that can make a person feel sick. In the home, fuel-burning devices for heating and cooking can be sources of carbon monoxide.

#### Install


- Carbon monoxide alarms should be installed in all homes, apartments, and workplaces.
- Install alarms in each sleeping area and on every level of the home.
- In the workplace, carbon monoxide alarms should be installed in areas where gas appliances are located, as well as areas with identified hazards.
- It is best to use interconnected alarms so when one sounds, all of them sound.

#### Inspect

Test carbon monoxide alarms once a month.

#### **Prevent CO Poisoning**

- Have a professional inspect your chimneys and heating equipment each year.
- Don't keep your car running inside your garage, even if your garage doors are open.
- Gas grills, charcoal grills, and generators can produce carbon monoxide. Use them outdoors in well-ventilated areas away from windows, doors and vent openings.
- Clear all debris from dryers, furnaces, stoves, and fireplace vents.
- Open the damper when using a fireplace for adequate ventilation.
- Never use your oven or stove to heat your home.
- Do not cover the bottom of natural gas or propane ovens with aluminum foil. Doing so blocks the combustion air flow through the appliance and can produce carbon monoxide.



Mobile users in Orange County have the ability to send text messages to 9-1-1, giving hearing and speech impaired residents, or those in situations where it is too dangerous to dial 9-1-1, a potentially life-saving option. This tool is available to the public using a mobile phone or device. The location services on the mobile device must be enabled.

#### **Guidelines:**

- Enter the numbers "911" in the text "To" field.
- The first text message to 9-1-1 should contain the location and brief description of the emergency and the type of help needed (police, fire, ambulance).
- Push the "Send" button.
- Be prepared to answer questions and follow instructions from the 9-1-1 text taker.
- Text in simple words. Photos and videos cannot be sent to 911.
- Do not use abbreviations, emojis, or slang.
- Keep text messages brief and concise.
- Text must be in English. There is currently no language interpretation for text available.
