Our team has worked diligently over the last 10 years to expand the cultural equity of the greater Los Angeles area through our programming. To date we have facilitated and commissioned over two dozen public murals and art installations and have beautified our neighborhoods with 40 utility boxes. We have worked closely with cities, including council districts, BIDS, chambers of commerce, neighborhood councils, businesses, community organizations and civic entities. We are big believers that collaboration is key and we love being able to create and facilitate opportunities for artists to show their work and connect with their community.

For this project, we have partnered with artist Steve Martinez. Steve is a contemporary fine artist, muralist, photographer, and graphic designer whose art explores the relationship between the historic and modern relationship of communities through iconic symbology. His public art experience includes murals, art installations, book illustrations and couture fashion. The vision for the murals at the Westminster development is to create an art piece that is bold and contemporary as well as both complementary to the use of the space, and accessible to the community and families living in the area. The art piece will also highlight the local history thereby linking the past to the present.

As the project managers we will ensure the project is overseen and managed to meet deadlines and budget, as well as take care of communication between the client, city officials and obtain any necessary permits so that the artist can focus on the creation and the art project itself. We are very excited about this opportunity and what we can offer as a creative team to enhance the public experience of the Westminster development and strengthen the city's public art portfolio.

#### Mural Concept:

The primary intent of this mural is to enliven this crossing and create a vibrant entrance of the new Meta Housing development with a bright and bold mural. With its flat-geometric contemporary design and realistic rendering of the lotus flower and butterflies, this diptych mural will capture the attention of pedestrians and drivers alike. The design and color palette will compliment the architectural style and will create a colorful focal point on this newly revitalized busy intersection.

#### **Artist Statement:**

Westminster is known for its many Vietnamese refugees who immigrated to the city during the 1980s and thus has the highest concentration of Vietnamese Americans of any community in the United States. The two other biggest populations that follow are Latinos and Whites. Therefore, I think it's important to represent and celebrate this diversity and use it as the bedrock of the mural concept. The Lotus flower will be the backdrop of these pieces representing the Vietnamese community as it is their national flower and it signifies purity, serenity, commitment and optimism for the future. The rest of the imagery will consist of butterflies that will represent all other cultures in Westminster juxtaposing them with my signature style and glitch elements to represent our present time in modern society. The monarch butterfly is used to represent Latinos, swallowtail to represent Northern America, and the grassy tiger butterfly to represent Vietnamese and Asian cultures. The imagery suggests all these cultures living together harmoniously and thriving. The butterflies also represent the journey of migration since they naturally migrate great distances to survive and thrive; much like the Vietnamese and Latinos have done for many years. As an artist and a child of immigrant parents, it's relevant that my work touches on this topic in how migrants change the landscape into something beautiful and are an important part of the social fabric. Since this project consist of two separate walls, it will be designed as a diptych. This allows for each mural to be a stand alone piece but when seen together from afar, they complement each other and blend to look as one cohesive piece.

My plan for community engagement is to work alongside my project management team at 11:11 A Creative Collective as well the Meta Housing staff to coordinate a community meeting and get feedback on the mural concept. All of my work involves some form of social practice as I'm interested in the discourse between the symbolic and the realistic within daily urban life and how art can connect, uplift, honor and preserve communal identity. I believe this work will contribute to the visitor experience of downtown Westminster by evoking an immediate sense of beauty and harmony. Upon reading about the mural's inspiration (via a plaque) I hope to instill a sense of community pride and honor all those that have made Westminster a great place to live in.






