COVID-19 VACCINE NOW AVAILABLE TO RESIDENTS AGES 65 AND OLDER

The County Health Officer announced on January 11 that all Orange County (OC) residents ages 65 and older are now eligible to be vaccinated against COVID-19.

All residents eligible for vaccination must register and make an appointment through Othena at https://othena.com/individuals.php or by downloading the mobile app.



The success of the County's phased, tiered <u>vaccination plan</u> depends on everyone being patient and allowing priority groups to be vaccinated first. As the vaccine becomes more plentiful, additional appointments will become available, and eligibility will open up to other groups. Visit the <u>Othena website</u> or app to join the vaccine interest list.

*Vaccinations at the Disneyland Resort Super Pod Site are by appointment only through the Othena app. Those without an appropriate appointment and proper identification will be turned away.

AVOID COVID-19 VACCINE SCAMS

Tips from the Westminster Police Department



YOU WILL NOT BE ASKED FOR MONEY TO ENHANCE YOUR RANKING FOR VACCINE ELIGIBILITY.

You can't pay to have your name placed on a list nor to get early access to the vaccine.

GOVERNMENT & STATE OFFICIALS WILL NOT CALL YOU TO OBTAIN PERSONAL INFO IN ORDER TO RECEIVE THE VACCINE.

Be cautious of unsolicited requests for your personal, medical, and financial information. No one should be asking for your social security number, bank account number, or credit card number.

IGNORE OFFERS FOR VACCINATIONS AND MIRACLE TREATMENTS OR CURES.

Be suspicious of any unexpected calls or visitors offering COVID-19 tests or supplies. Scammers are selling products to treat or prevent COVID-19 without proof that they work.





Scammers are using the coronavirus pandemic to benefit themselves. The personal information collected can be used to fraudulently bill federal health care programs and commit medical identity theft.

Medical Trained Volunteers


- Medical licensed volunteers able to assist with vaccine preparation and distribution.

Extended Tax Filing Deadline

The California Department of Tax and Fee Administration (CDTFA) is providing a three-month extension for businesses to file and pay their taxes and fees originally due between December 15, 2020, and April 30, 2021.

Taxpayers reporting less than \$1,000,000 in taxes and fees on a return originally due during this period are not required to seek an extension from CDTFA. Relief will be automatically provided.



RESOURCES FOR RENTERS

Eviction Moratorium for Residential Tenants

On August 31, 2020 a new California law – <u>The Tenant,</u> <u>Homeowner and Small Landlord Relief and Stabilization Act of</u> <u>2020</u> - took effect to provide relief to residential tenants.

If you are unable to pay your rent due to a coronavirus-related hardship between September 1, 2020 and January 31, 2021, you must also pay at least 25 percent of the rent due to avoid eviction.

Beginning February 1, 2021, tenants will have to pay the full amount of rent to be protected from eviction.

Beginning March 1, 2021, landlords can take tenants to small claims court to recover unpaid rent debt regardless of how much the tenant owes. **Read more here.**

The City of Westminster received a special allocation of Community Development Block Grant Coronavirus (CDBG-CV3) funds to be used to respond to the coronavirus (COVID-19) through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act). On December 9, 2020, the Westminster City Council approved funding of CDBG-CV3 funds to provide limited rental assistance to qualified Westminster residents financially impacted due to COVID-19.

Applications must be submitted to the City by January 28, 2021 at 5:00 p.m. Applicants will be selected by a lottery system and application approval is subject to funding availability. For more information visit www.bit.ly/WCARES.

HOUSING ELEMENT UPDATE

The City of Westminster is in the process of updating the 2021-2029 Housing Element.

What is a Housing Element?

The Housing Element is a section of the City's General Plan that looks at housing needs and conditions within Westminster. It is a policy document that identifies goals, policies and programs that the City uses to direct and guide actions related to housing.

Why is the City updating its Housing Element?

Each city and county in California is required to have a Housing Element and update it at least every 8 years. Updating the Housing Element gives the City a clear picture of housing-related issues such as: housing supply and demand, the types of housing available within the City, housing affordability, and homelessness. Once the Housing Element is updated, it must be approved by the California Department of Housing and Community Development. Updating our Housing Element will ensure that we meet State requirements, and make Westminster eligible for State grants and other funding sources. It will also give our elected and appointed officials clear guidance on housing issues facing Westminster.





PUBLIC SAFETY MESSAGE FROM ORANGE COUNTY FIRE AUTHORITY

SMOKE ALARMS



Almost two-thirds of all home fire deaths occur in homes with no working smoke alarms. Protect your family by installing smoke alarms, inspecting them regularly, and practicing home fire drills.



Working smoke alarms reduce your risk of dying in a home fire by 50%.

Install

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, in hallways outside bedrooms or sleeping areas, and on every level of the home.
- Install smoke alarms on the ceiling or high on a wall. Make sure they are at least 10 feet from the stove and 3 feet from doors leading to the kitchen to reduce false alarms.
- Keep smoke alarms away from bathrooms with tubs or showers, heating or cooling ducts or vents, and ceiling or whole-house fans.
- Check the back for the manufacture date and replace all alarms when they are 10 years old.
- Use interconnected smoke alarms so when one sounds, they all sound.
- It's safest to use both ionization and photoelectric smoke alarms. Ionization alarms are quicker to warn about flaming fires. Photoelectric alarms are quicker to warn about smoldering fires.
- Special alarms with strobe lights and bed shakers are available for people who are deaf or hard of hearing.

Inspect

- Test all smoke alarms once a month.
- Follow the manufacturer's instructions for cleaning to keep smoke alarms working well.

Protect

- Draw a home escape plan that shows two ways out of every room and an outside meeting place.
- Teach children what the smoke alarm sounds like and what to do if they hear it.
- Practice home fire drills at least twice a year.
