Current Status (3/31/21): Orange Tier

- Bowling Alleys and Family Entertainment Centers
 - Can open indoors for naturally distanced activities, with modifications at 25% capacity
- Cultural Ceremonies
 - Can open indoors with modifications at 50% capacity or 200 people, whichever is fewer
- Dance Studios, Gyms, Fitness Centers, Yoga Studios, and Climbing Walls
 - Can open indoors with modifications at 25% capacity
- Funeral Homes
 - Can open indoors with modifications at 50% capacity
- Indoor Playgrounds (Includes Bounce Centers, Ball Pits, and Laser Tag)
 - Can open indoors for naturally distanced activities, with modifications at 25% capacity
- Libraries
 - Can open indoors at 100% capacity with modifications
- Movie Theaters
 - Can open indoors with modifications at 50% capacity or 200 people, whichever is fewer
- Museums, Zoos, and Aquariums
 - Can open indoors with modifications at 50% capacity
- Offices (non-essential businesses)
 - Can open indoors with modifications (encourage working remotely)
- Restaurants
 - Can open indoors with modifications at 50% capacity or 200 people, whichever is fewer
 - Wineries, breweries, and distilleries can open indoors with modifications at 25% capacity or 100 people, whichever is fewer
 - Bars can open outdoors only with modifications
- Places of Worship
 - Can open indoors with modifications at 50% capacity
- Retail (Includes Bookstores, Florists, Grocery, Home and Furnishing Stores, Jewelry, Sporting Goods, etc.)
 - Can open indoors at 100% capacity with modifications
- Shopping Malls and Swap Meets
 - Can open indoors at 100% capacity with modifications
 - Food courts can open with limited capacity of 50% or 200 people (whichever is less)
 - Closed common areas
- Hair Salons, Barbershops, and Personal Care Services (e.g. Nail Salons, Body Waxing, Tattoo Parlors, Piercing Studios, Skin Care and Cosmetology, Massage Services)
 - May remain open indoors with modifications
- Weddings
 - Ceremonies can take place indoors with modifications at 50% capacity
- Youth and Adult Recreational Sports
 - Some outdoor high-contact sports and indoor low-contact sports are permitted. Guidance available at COVID19.ca.gov.



<u>Current revenue projections</u> for FY 2020-21 are in line with budgeted numbers with the exception of sales tax/transaction use tax which is projected to be higher than budgeted.

Sales tax and transaction use tax receipts totals shown in the table above represent four months of receipts from the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration (CDTFA). Projections anticipate FY 2020-21 receipts to be slightly above the actuals received for FY 2019-20. This is still a very early estimate as we have only received the 4 months of receipts for FY 2020-21; however, the increase would be \$2.3 million higher than budgeted.

General Fund expenditures are tracking on budget. Expenditures for the 2nd quarter of FY 2020-21 are \$1.5 million over the prior fiscal year at the same time. This is due to the increase in PERS costs and OCFA contract costs.

At this time, revenue and expenditures are tracking within budget so no budget adjustment was necessary. The next update will be provided after nine months of revenue and expenditures, for the period of July 1, 2020 through March 31, 2021.

RESOURCES FOR RENTERS

Eviction Moratorium EXTENDED

On January 29, 2021 the Governor signed legislation to extend the eviction moratorium and assist tenants and small property owners impacted by COVID-19.

If you are unable to pay your rent due to a coronavirus-related hardship between September 1, 2020 and June 30, 2021, you must also pay at least 25 percent of the rent due to avoid eviction.

Tenants are still responsible for paying unpaid amounts to property owners, but those unpaid amounts cannot be the basis for an eviction, even after the moratorium ends.

Why is the City updating its Housing Element?

Each city and county in California is required to have a Housing Element and update it at least every eight years. Updating the Housing Element gives the City a clear picture of housing-related issues such as: housing supply and demand, types of housing available within the City, housing affordability, and homelessness. Once the Housing Element is updated, it must be approved by the California Department of Housing and Community Development. Updating our Housing Element will ensure that we meet State requirements, and make Westminster eligible for State grants and other funding sources. 

PUBLIC SAFETY MESSAGE FROM ORANGE COUNTY FIRE AUTHORITY

BBQ SAFETY



A BBQ that is too close to items that can burn is a fire hazard. Here are a few tips to help you stay safe and avoid a grilling fire.



If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department. Do not move the grill.



- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should be used outdoors only.
- Grills should be placed a safe distance from the home, deck railings, tables, overhanging branches, and areas where people gather.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grates and in the trays below the grill.
- Never leave a heated grill, lighter, or matches unattended.

Charcoal Grills

- If you use starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire while cooking.
- When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool (for about 48 hours) before disposing in a metal container.

Propane Grills

- Check the gas tank hose for leaks before grilling.
- If your grill has a gas leak, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If a leak occurs while grilling, call the fire department.
- If the flame goes out, turn the grill and gas off and wait at least 5 minutes before re-lighting it.

EARTHQUAKE WARNING CALIFORNIA



Natural disasters, like earthquakes, happen unexpectedly and can create major disruptions that last long after the event is over. By being prepared and planning ahead, Californians can quickly take life-saving actions to keep them safe in an earthquake.

To ensure all Californians are earthquake prepared, the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) developed Earthquake Warning California, which is the nation's first statewide earthquake warning system that provides several seconds of warning to mobile device users in the area before shaking occurs. Earthquake Warning California offers no-cost earthquake warning resources, including:

- MyShake App. A mobile app that can be downloaded for mobile devices at no-cost from Google Play the Apple App Store. App location services must be set to "always on" so that ground sensors can alert those in the nearby area when shaking is detected.
- <u>Android Earthquake Alerts.</u> An earthquake warning system available to any new or updated Android devices that uses that same technology as the MyShake App.
- <u>Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEAs).</u> Text-like messages from the government during emergency situations. This includes: Presidential, Imminent Threat (fire, earthquake, floods, etc.), and AMBER alerts.

Earthquake Warning California resources are designed to notify users to quickly take protective action such as to drop, cover, and hold on. These earthquake warning tools can help protect lives and prevent damage to properties in the areas hardest hit during an earthquake. In serious shaking situations, individuals may be knocked down to the ground, so sheltering prior to shaking is the prudent thing to do.
