



The state has given Westminster a million and a half dollars to help honor a Mexican-American family fight against school segregation in the 1940s. Five thousand children were represented in the Mendez v. Westminster case, which came before Brown v. Board of Education. "It was me, Sylvia and Jerome that got turned away from the high school, that's now a retirement home." Gonzalo Mendez Jr. says even though his family won the case, it was tough at first. "Some of the people got called bad names like that, but now it seemed like it never happened." The one point five million dollars will help build a park and trail, which includes statues and interactive plaques so people can access the history of the case from their phone in Westminster.
