Request for Parking Restrictions at 14121 Cedarwood Street (Westminster School District)

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Traffic Commission recommend the installation of parking restrictions on the west side of Cedarwood Street for a distance of 20 feet to the north of the southern driveway at 14121 Cedarwood Street (Westminster School District).

DISCUSSION

Staff received a request from Mr. David Johnson, President of Westminster School District (WSD), to investigate site visibility concerns at the southern driveway located along the west side of Cedarwood Street. Mr. Johnson is concerned that there is not enough sight distance to the north to safely perform turn maneuvers from the driveway onto Cedarwood Street. Regularly large parked vehicles along Cedarwood Street make it difficult to clearly observe southbound oncoming traffic.

Staff performed several site visits to observe the traffic conditions of the streets in question, researched accident records and speed surveys at the study location as part of the engineering analysis.

The Traffic Engineering Division considers on-street parking to be a commodity. Contrary to past trends, today, most households own and operate more than one vehicle. The City must carefully consider the removal of onstreet parking for safety concerns while protecting on-street parking as the demand for parking continues to increase across the City. Two issues come into play when considering the removal of on-street parking. Is the elimination of on-street parking due to a safety concern or driver comfort?

Exhibit A illustrates the study vicinity and adjacent land uses.

Staff recommends the installation of parking restrictions on the west side of Cedarwood Street for a distance of 20 feet to the north of the southern driveway at 14121 Cedarwood Street for enhanced visibility. If the parking restrictions are implemented, they would enhance vehicle maneuverability at the subject driveway, with minimal impact to on-street parking in the neighborhood.

Local businesses and residents were notified of tonight's meeting.


