

Proclamation

LUNAR NEW YEAR - TÉT NGUYÊN ĐÁN

February 10, 2024

WHEREAS, Lunar New Year, also referred to as the Spring Festival, Chinese New Year, Lantern Festival, is traditionally celebrated throughout Asia by more than 2 billion people worldwide and marks the new lunar calendar year; and

WHEREAS, Lunar New Year in Vietnam, known as Tết Nguyên Đán, or Tết for short, means "thank goodness," and is one of the most important holiday celebrations in the Vietnamese culture, representing hope and love, and is a time to reunite with family and friends; and

WHEREAS, this year, Lunar New Year begins February 10, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the Lunar New Year/Spring Festival also marks the transition from one animal to the next on the zodiac, with February 10, 2024 signaling the start of the "Year of the Dragon," according to the Vietnamese zodiac; and

WHEREAS, Little Saigon has a diverse community that includes the largest population of Vietnamese people outside of Vietnam, and they celebrate the Lunar New Year as Tết; and

WHEREAS, the City of Westminster and Little Saigon community generally celebrate with festivities, including gatherings, festivals, and a world-renowned annual Tet Parade; and

WHEREAS, the City of Westminster wishes good fortune, health, and happiness to all during the Lunar New Year celebration and through the next year.

NOW, THEREFORE I, Chi Charlie Nguyen, Mayor of the City of Westminster, on behalf of Vice Mayor Kimberly Ho, and Council Members Amy Phan West, Carlos Manzo, and NamQuan Nguyen do hereby proclaim February 10, 2024 as the beginning of the LUNAR NEW YEAR - TÉT NGUYÊN ĐÁN in the City of Westminster in celebration of the "Year of the Dragon," and encourage all residents to join in the celebration for a prosperous and healthy new year.
