What is the Consolidated Plan?



 Required to receive Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and HOME funds from HUD



- A five-year Consolidated Plan
 - Analysis of housing and community development needs
 - Strategy to address those needs Establish general priority needs
 - Annual plans Identify specific programs and budgets for annual CDBG and HOME allocations

Potential Uses of CDBG Funds


Must meet National Objectives:

- Benefit low- and moderate-income persons
- Eliminate slum and blight
- Meet an urgent community need (occurred within the last 18 months that would threaten public health and safety, and that the community has no other resources to address the issues)

Potential Uses of CDBG Funds

- Eligible activities and projects include:
 - Creation and retention of affordable housing
 - Infrastructure improvements
 - Community facilities
 - Community services
 - Special needs services
 - Economic development
- 70% of CDBG funds must be used for activities that benefit lowand moderate-income persons

City of Westminster Low- and Moderate-Income Areas



Potential Uses for HOME funds

- Program designed exclusively to create affordable housing for low-income households.
 - Building, buying, and/or rehabilitating affordable rental and owner housing
 - Providing direct rental assistance to low-income individuals


