

Businesses are currently prohibited from providing indoor services, but may temporarily convert portions of adjacent parking areas, walkways, patios, sidewalks, and public rights-of-way into customer service areas. **Once approved, a Temporary Outdoor Permit is in effect for 60 days.**

WATER SAFETY BARRIERS



Identify your risks and have multiple barriers in place to keep children and adults safe from all water sources. Barriers buy time and offer protection if they are installed correctly and are in good working condition. The more barriers you install and maintain, the safer your family will be.



No single barrier provides 100% protection.
Multiple barriers must be in place so that if one fails, there is another to slow or prevent a child from reaching the water alone and unsupervised.

Non-Climbable Fences

- Install a 4-sided isolation fence tall enough (4-5 feet) to prevent children from climbing over.
- Make sure the bottom of the fence is close enough to the ground to prevent a child from crawling under.
- Ensure patio furniture is kept away from the fence so a child cannot use the items to climb.

Self-Closing or Latching Gates

- Install a self-closing or self-latching gate with a locking mechanism.
- Gates should be installed so that they open outward, away from the pool.
- Regularly inspect gates for damages to ensure a child's safety.

Pool and Spa Covers

- Purchase and use a pool and spa cover to protect children and pets.
- Covers for the pool and spa act as a horizontal fence should children or pets get near the water.

Alarms

- Having alarms on your doors, windows, and on the pool is important in case a child or pet comes in contact with water unexpectedly.
- Child wristband alarms and pet collars are available to purchase for additional protection. The base alarms are triggered as soon as the child or pet gets them wet, alarming others in the area.
- Purchase and use portable alarms that can be used at any pool, residential or community.

Indoor Barriers

 A child can drown in less than two inches of water. Purchase and install indoor barriers such as toilet latches, baby gates, and child-safe doorknob handle covers to ensure children cannot get into any rooms where water can be accessed.

Do-It-Yourself Solutions for Mosquito Issues



Did you know?

Many mosquitoes breed in small water sources in residential backyards, and they do not fly far from the source. Eliminating these small water sources can reduce the number of mosquitoes on your property. Search around your property for any standing water (indoors and out) and discard unused containers. Be sure to scrub unused containers thoroughly to remove mosquito eggs. Watch the "Meet Your New Neighbor" series of videos to learn about mosquitoes and how to eliminate them from your property. Download and review the checklist to conduct a self-inspection on your property. Make sure to inspect your front yard, side, backyard, and inside the home.

- DIY mosquito breeding source checklist

What to expect:

- Eliminating water sources will not provide immediate results; adult mosquitoes die off in approximately 10 days, but eliminating water sources reduces the number of larvae and pupae that will eventually emerge into biting adults.
- Prevent mosquitoes from entering your home by keeping doors and windows closed. If windows and doors must be kept open, ensure your window and door screens are free of holes or tears.
- Wear an EPA-approved insect repellent to keep mosquitoes from biting you and your family.


Election Information

A General Municipal Election will be held in the City of Westminster on Tuesday, November 3, 2020 for the election of one council member in District 2 and one council member in District 3. Each seat is for a term of four years. There will also be one measure on the ballot pertaining to term limits for elected officials.

District-Based Elections Coming This November



On December 18, 2019, the City Council adopted an ordinance for district-based elections. Beginning in November 2020, elections for city council members will be by district. The mayor is still an at-large seat.

What are district-based elections? Each of the newly developed Council districts will be represented by a single council member living within that district chosen by the voters of that district. This provides a new opportunity for geographic and demographic representation based on the uniqueness of each district.

Why did the City change its voting process? The City received a demand alleging that its at-large elections violate California law. Under the law, the City was required to go through a process of public hearings and take input on what districts should look like based on geography, population, natural barriers, and communities of interest. The objective of the process was to ensure compliance with the California Voting Rights Act (CVRA) and try to ensure minority votes are not diluted. While the City did not believe it had violated any laws, cities that opposed changing to by-district elections have incurred many millions of dollars in legal fees and faced court-ordered districting.

Which districts seats are up for election in November 2020 and how can I run for office? Districts 2 and 3 seats are being voted this November. You must be a registered voter for at least 30 days within District 2 or 3 prior to the time you pull nomination papers to be an eligible candidate. For additional requirements for running for office or additional information regarding districts, contact the City Clerk's Office at (714) 548-3237. Nomination period begins July 13 and ends August 7.
